INDEX at the "Dialogues for Transformation," within the framework of the forum on Security and Justice

On February 12, Index Nacional attended a meeting with the team of presidential candidate Claudia Sheinbaum, where José Ramón de la Fuente, Arturo Saldívar, Omar García Harfuch, and Altagracia Gómez spoke.

Among the topics to which Index contributed was to effectively reinforce security for travel on roads, not only in the north but in most of the country, because incidents of theft of goods and damage to carriers occur even in the center and Bajío regions.

It was pointed out that insecurity in transportation has a significant social and public image impact due to the deaths and injuries of drivers; economically, the negative effect on exports (agro-industry and manufacturing) and imports was mentioned.

Another negative effect of insecurity is the message that foreign investors and businesspeople may receive, considering Mexico as an option for relocation, or for already established companies regarding their decisions to expand or bring in more production processes.

About justice, the attendees expressed that it is essential to maintain and strengthen the rule of law, expedite judicial processes, and ensure the autonomy of justice institutions.

Omar García Harfuch

Take responsibility, do not evade reality. Conduct geographic monitoring of federal and common law crimes. After the diagnosis, resolutions must be reached, and policies to prevent crime must be strengthened.

Improve law enforcement conditions (operations, equipment, training, remuneration).

Apply intelligence and investigation methods.

Inter-institutional and interstate coordination is required.

Create a system that not only benefits the wealthy, so that there are no prisoners without due process or sentencing, meaning, accelerating procedures and trials.

If the justice system is incompetent, security will not operate correctly either.

Coordination is required between prosecutors, local and federal courts, regulatory bodies, public defense and penitentiaries.

Promote civic justice, i.e., among neighbors and citizens in cases of abuse such as parking, use of public space like street privatization, and solutions to issues between citizens such as garbage collection or water use, control of irregular construction projects, etc.

CONCLUSIONS

- * Avoid "partisan" justice.
- * Security must be consistent.
- * Without justice, security cannot be strengthened.
- * Companies and businesses cannot be generated, and nearshoring cannot be leveraged if security fails.
- * Address cybersecurity.
